



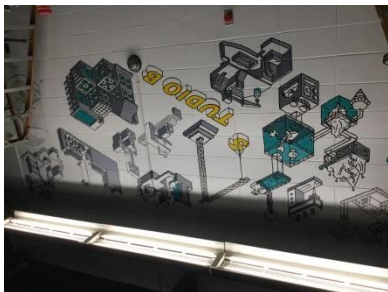
BHS CONNECTIONS

We were pleased to showcase the work of our faculty and students to Secretary Holcombe when she visited on Wednesday April 17. She was been invited by Vitaliy Kulapin, tech integration specialist and visited both Burlington High School and the Burlington Technical Center (BTC). She learned how Ms. Botelho is using technology to facilitate student centered learning through the Physical Education Capstone course and how students' personalized learning plans are being developed through the use of technology. While Secretary Holcombe was here she also learned about BTC's Digital Media Lab and how the new Maker Space will be a shared resource in our school community.



Burlington Technical Center's Maker Space is almost up and running! We've done a lot of great work in the past four months, including painting, fixing heating,

purchasing furniture and doing electrical work. The space has truly been transformed. Computer Systems students visited last week in an effort to give advice on how we should set up workspace flow and ideas on what additions we need to the space. Our next steps are inviting community partners such as BCA and Generator to visit the space and prepare for our artists in residence program
