

SCHOOL BASED HEALTH CENTER

Sore throat that won't let up? Questions about a weird rash? Ear pain that comes and goes? Recurring headache or stomachache making you miss school?

Come along to the School Based Health Center at BHS. On Monday and Friday mornings the SBHC works out of the Health Office and is staffed by UVM Pediatrics whose providers offer health services to any student (need a parent/guardian to sign up). The School Based Health Center provides basic primary health services as well as facilitates mental health services. In addition, the Center provides information and referrals to other community services.

Center staff members take special care not to disrupt the existing relationships between students, families and their primary care providers. By stopping in during the school day you can miss less class time and avoid the need for a ride to your health provider. The services are provided without copay and insurance will be billed. BHS SCHOOL SAFETY

School Safety is always first and foremost on our minds at BHS. We conduct ten drills per school year, five fire evacuation drills and five lockdown drills. The Burlington Fire Department has been key in helping us to plan for fire drills and the Burlington Police Department assists us with each lockdown drill. Each instructional space has a uniform "Classroom Emergency Guide." The language used in this guide is consistent across the district. Our new phone system allows single button dialing to the front office and the nurse's office and direct dial to 911 where the dispatcher can ascertain the location of the call.

Just a few reminders about drills: in a fire evacuation drill it is expected that everyone leave the building in a timely and orderly fashion. When we are in lockdown, the expectation is that no one uses their cell phone. Silence in lockdown drills is critical. We do understand that it is concerning when we are in lockdown and know that we are adhering to best practice with this recommendation. The best we can do is plan for the most common scenario and understand that no circumstances under which we would need to evacuate would be ordinary. A multitude of variables would be at play in any emergency.

On November 20 and 21 the BHS/BTC campus hosted a training in ALICE for professionals from all over New England. It was a "train the trainer" event. There were thirty-eight attendees, including staff from the district. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) Training is the leading program for response to violent critical incidents (VCI). VCI are man-made forms of violent disaster, including: active shooter, violent intruder, mass shooting, terrorism, workplace violence, and other unexpected tragedies. The mission of ALICE is to save lives – this training program empowers individuals to make their own survival decisions should they be faced with violence. The district will provide guidance on the use of this training in the coming months.

On November 30 district staff attended the Governor's School Safety Conference hosted by Education Secretary Holcombe and Public Safety Commissioner Anderson. The all-day conference was designed to inform participants of the best and promising practices in school emergency preparednes that included managing the media and crisis communication, how to conduct an effective school safety exercise, the impacts of trauma after a critical incident, tactical emergency medicine and more.

The most important aspect of safety is for everyone to be doing their part to keep our school safe. Doors need to be locked and warning signs need to be brought to our attention. Please encourage your students to do their part in keeping BHS a safe learning environment!

INFO ON PERSONALIZED LEARNING PLANS

Personalized Learning Plans are important in our transition towards statewide requirements of Act 77.

"Act 77 of 2013 paves the way for schools to 'work with every student in grade seven through grade 12 in an ongoing personalized learning planning process that: (A) identifies the student's emerging abilities, aptitude, and disposition; (B) includes participation by families and other engaged adults; (C) guides decisions regarding course offerings and other high-quality educational experiences; and (D) is documented by a personalized learning plan (PLP).' PLPs should be developmentally appropriate and define the scope and rigor of academic and experiential opportunities necessary for a secondary student to complete secondary school successfully, attain postsecondary readiness, and be prepared to engage actively in civic life." Students who entered BHS as freshmen in 2016-2017 are the first cohort of students affected by this change in education.


PLPs are to be designed with the concepts of Plan, Do Check Adjust! Please review AOE Personalized Learning Plans brief presentation for a reminder and an overview.

If you are the parent/guardian of a student in ninth or tenth grade, please ask your student to share with you the link to their Personalized Learning Plan. It is a Google link and is an important part of your child's journey through high school. Personal Learning Plans are at the forefront of student-centered learning. As students are thinking about course selections and electives, it is important for students to consider their interests, goals, and future plans. Currently PLPs are being supported in advisory. Please contact your child's advisor if you need assistance or have questions.

CONGRATULATIONS SCHOLARS BOWL TEAM!

The BHS Scholars' Bowl team showed its depth at the Pre-Holiday Academic Tournament on December 1st, placing all three of its teams in the top playoff tier in the region's largest tournament.

A total of 58 teams from 25 schools in Vermont, New York and New Hampshire competed in the event and the Burlington teams placed fourth, 13th and 14th out of 42 teams in the varsity bracket.

The A team of Mary Markley, Teagan Hart, Delia McConnell and Audrey Nichols won its all four of its preliminary rounds to enter the playoffs as the third seed. BHS then won its first two playoff matches before falling to Hanover in the semifinals and dropping a close decision to CVU in the match that decided third place.

Burlington's B team of Nathan Arre, Daniel Halladay, Emma True, Isa Block, Zoe Crane and Clare Maxwell and its C team of Isidora Bailly-Hall, Bella Farkas, Anna Halladay and Vilena Lee each completed the preliminary rounds with 3-1 records to make the cut for the 16-team A playoffs. Both teams lost their first two playoffs matches but won their third, setting up a head-to-head matchup in the final round that BHS B won in a 170-155 thriller.

Mary was the tournament's fourth-leading scorer while Isidora, Teagan and Daniel were also among the top 10 individually out of 250 players.

The tournament was the last of first of the first semester for BHS, which heads into the winter break with a varsity record of 28 wins and five losses. Our next tournament will be the Addison Region at CVU on January 5th.



2018 Year End Studies (YES) Session

Overview

The BHS Year End Studies session concludes each school year by offering all students of the BHS community exciting alternatives for learning. These non-traditional courses expand student understanding and inspire new student interests. Intensive, interest-driven opportunities enhance enthusiasm for learning and strengthen relationships within BHS and the Burlington community.

Length of Session

Ten days of classes with an 11th day being a Presentation of Learning day (POL day). The 2018 YES Session will run from Wed, May 30 through wed. June 13, 2018. The Presentation of Learning (POL) day will take place from 8:05-1pm on Wednesday, June 13, 2018.

Options

Students could opt to participate in:

- two half-day courses (morning/afternoon)
- one full-day course (9:30-2:15pm)
- travel learning experience including language and service learning trips (added cost to student)
- BTC class and one half-day YES course
- Independent Study half or full day grades 11 and 12 only (restrictions apply, see Independent Study Guidelines)

Registration

Course descriptions will be accessible on the BHS website prior to registration. An online registration form will be available for all students at the end of first semester. Course assignments will be posted the end of March. There is no add/drop period for YES classes.

Attendance

Students must attend and participate in the YES Session. Students must attend 9 of the 10 days of the YES course classes to receive credit. All students must participate in the Presentation of Learning (POL). <u>Reminder: The YES session is an intensive 10-day session and part of</u> the academic school year, please schedule all appointments before the start of YES or in the afternoons after 2:15pm. Please plan family vacations after the last day school Wed., June 13th.

Grading

Credit/No Credit

Graduation Requirement

Successful completion in YES Session for each year at BHS is a graduation requirement. A special note to seniors: Seniors who fail to earn YES Session credit will NOT be eligible to attend the graduation ceremony or receive their diploma. The senior must successfully complete a YES Session option for credit recovery (see section below).

Options for Students Who Do Not Earn Credit for the YES Session

Students who fail to earn YES credit, can recover the YES Session credit by successfully completing one of the follow:

- -To enroll in a college course through College Connections (grades 10-12)
- -Attend an academic camp or institute
- -Community Service (These hours would not count towards the 40hr graduation requirement.)

Credit Recovery

Credit Recovery is for students who fail a course during the regular school year with an overall average of 53%-59%. Credit for this course is earned pending teacher approval.

BTC Students

Students participating in BTC programs will attend their BTC classes as regularly scheduled AND participate in one YES course. For example, if you take a morning BTC class you will take an afternoon YES course.


