Art awards are given to works that best exemplify originality, technical skill, and the emergence of a personal voice or vision. Gold Key works are submitted for national level recognition, with national awards being announced at the regional awards ceremony.

From February 17 through March 10, 2018, the BMAC will exhibit this year's award winning work by students from throughout Vermont. ABOVE THE INFLUENCE STUDENTS SPEAK OUT AGAINST FLAVORED TOBACCO

On Tuesday February 6th, Above the Influence (ATI BTV) members Balkisa Abdikadir, Eliza Abedi, Hawa Adam, and Libby Branch rallied at the State House to voice their opposition to flavored tobacco products and to educate legislators about the dangers these products pose to youth. At least two-thirds of youth tobacco users report using non-cigarette tobacco products like e-cigarettes, cigars, and chew "because they come in flavors I like" and nearly a quarter (24%) of all Vermont high school students have tried a flavored tobacco product (CounterBalance). The rally was



hosted by OVX (Our Voices Xposed), Vermont's youth-led movement to end the influence of tobacco on kids and teens in Vermont, and CounterBalance Vermont, a campaign to end the influence of flavored tobacco on Vermont's youth. Hawa was selected to serve as a media representative for the rally. She addressed the rally crowd on the State House steps, "I have friends and family members trying these products [flavored tobacco].. being deceived by these products, and I do not want to continue to see this."
