

# Burlington City & Lake Semester Named Outstanding Flagship Project



Burlington City & Lake Semester (BCL) is an immersive semester program offered at BHS for interested students who utilize the city of Burlington as their classroom. Since it's inception in 2018, the BCL team (comprised of Signe Daly, Andy Baker, Dov Stucker, and Peter McConville, have given students at BHS an opportunity to experience their city unlike ever before.

Over the past two years, BCL has become a well known partner within the community, giving students the chance to gain experience working alongside organizations such as Shelburne Farms and the City of Burlington in a number of capacities.

Just before Holiday break, it was announced that BCL received the honor of being named an Outstanding Flagship Project by the Global RCE Centre, a division of United Nations University. This award was presented to the Greater Burlingt Regional Center of Expertise (RCE) in Education for Sustainable development, which

Includes BCL's partners at Shelburne Farms, the University of Vermont, and the City of Burlington.

"I know I speak for the whole BCL faculty team when I say that we are delighted to receive this recognition for BCL," Andy Barker, Project Director for BCL stated upon receiving the award, "and also for the Burlington School District. We have an amazing network of partners who continue to collaborate on the success of BCL."

#### WITH PRINCIPAL NOEL GREEN



Dear BHS Community,



By now, we have all been witness to what transpired in Washington DC this week. It was obviously disturbing, as what initially began as a legal protest turned violent, which is never acceptable. The ultimate price was paid as four people died during this incident.

As members of our society, it is always important for us to have a forum to discuss these types of tragic occurrences. It is especially important for our youth to have a platform, as they are just beginning to understand the world and need a way to verbalize their thoughts, which leads to them being able to synthesize what is happening around them. We as adults have a responsibility to assist our youth with this process.

I believe that the incidents from this week are a call for all of us to stay actively involved in what's happening in our country and around the world. We should seek to be civic-minded and aware of our responsibilities as part of the Constitution. We should also never ignore the fact that injustice exists all over the world, but by maintaining a strong democracy, we can at least make movement towards ending injustice.

In the immediate, I have included in this correspondence some resources from our counseling department if students need to talk about what happened. In the long term, we are excited about how we will engage with our students, especially using an equity lens. One example includes the coming introduction of a film series that both faculty and students will participate in beginning on the MLK holiday. This activity is student-driven and is intended to be sustainable beyond MLK and Black History Month. The goal is for all of us to constantly be aware of what has shaped our society to be what it is today and to use that knowledge to then determine what we need to do to heal as a nation.

# PSAT's at Edmunds Middle School January 26th



#### **Attention 11th Grade Students and Families,**

We are gearing up for our **January 26, 2021 PSAT at Edmunds Middle School**. This test is part of the SAT suite of assessments, and can be a very important test for your post-secondary (aka "life after high school") planning. The PSAT is considered the "Pre-SAT" and is free to all 11th grade students at Burlington High School. The SAT is one of two high-stakes college entrance examinations (the other being the ACT). One of the key reasons in taking this test is for the National Merit Scholarship Program. The score you earn on this test may qualify you to be a finalist for this prestigious scholarship program, and many other scholarship awards. Additionally, this is a great opportunity to practice your high-stakes-test-taking skills. After taking the test, your score report will allow you to create a College Board account and get personalized advice on how to improve your score in preparation for the SAT.

The test will begin between 8-9am (as soon as all students are COVID-screened and seated). The test itself is 2 hours and 45 minutes long; however, we will have students complete some general survey information required by the College Board prior to beginning the test. There are three key tests on the PSAT: Writing and Language, Math and Reading. The best way to prepare for this high-stakes test is to practice. Khan Academy has developed a partnership with SAT, and provides full-length practice tests and feedback for free.

On the day of the test, students will need to wear a mask, bring a state or school issued ID, and a calculator. If you do not have a calculator, BHS has plenty available to loan out for the day. Your room proctor will provide one if you need it. If you are bringing your own calculator, please review the <u>College Board's requirement for calculators</u>. Cell phones are not permitted to be used during the test, and your test will be voided if your phone is seen during the exam and breaks.

Students will be distanced in the classroom, with strict social distancing class capacity numbers in place. Due to this, we are requesting that students who plan to take this test complete the <u>PSAT Sign-up Form</u> by **Friday, January 15, 2021**. This will allow us to make sure we have the appropriate number of screeners, classrooms and proctors for the event.

For more information about the test, including a full length practice test, please use the <u>PSAT Student Guide</u>. Students may also pick up a hard copy of this booklet on Wednesday, January 13 outside of the Counseling Office at Edmunds Middle School.


