Summer 2023

- Explore interests

- Fill out "Letter of Recommendation Request" and Surveys in Naviance to provide letter writers with personal information and anecdotes that reveal the true you
- Consider enrolling in a Dual-Enrollment course



Senior Year

- Minimum of 5 classes each semester
- Maintain or increase the rigor of your program of studies - look for new or continued challenges and areas to expand or explore interests
- Consider Dual Enrollment high school credit for classes taken at local colleges
- Consider internship/job shadowing opportunities over the summer or next year

Community Service, Internship & Job Shadow

Community Service:

40 Hour - Graduation Requirement (10 hrs per year)

Students encouraged to seek out opportunities and non-profits that could help them pursue or explore new interests

<u>Internships & Job Shadows:</u>

Opportunity to learn about yourself, explore possible career interests, majors,

Great opportunities over breaks, summer, etc



College Search Characteristics

- Geographic location, setting (urban, suburban, small town, rural)
- Size of campus and student enrollment
- Admission requirementsaverage GPA, test scores or test optional, selectivity
- Majors and programs Ruggs Guide
- Costs, tuition, room & board, fees, expenses, financial aid
- Type of school (2 or 4 year), religious affiliation, male/female/co-ed, Canadian
- Housing opportunities
- Athletics (intramural, club, NCAA Division), clubs, activities, Greek life

College Applications: Quick Overview

- Deadlines: Early Action, Early Decision, Regular Decision, Rolling
- What are the Common & Coalition Applications?
- Components of the Application:
 - Personal information
 - Activities, work, service, internships, job shadows, honors, awards
 - Essay(s) summer start
 - o Teacher and other recommendations summer start
 - <u>Naviance</u>: Official Transcripts and Teacher Recommendations are requested and sent electronically through this program
 - Test Scores
 (sent directly from the ACT or SAT companies)
 - *Many schools are test optional
 - Application fee waiver
 - FAFSA & Financial Aid application

Dual Enrollment

- **Dual Enrollment** Every rising junior and senior has access to TWO free college classes.
 - Participating colleges; UVM, CCV, VTC, Landmark, Champlain College, & Saint Michael's College
 - Students receive 1 high school credit and 3 or 4 college credits for successful completion (transferable)
 - See what college campus feels like, learn professor's expectations and get a head start on your college degree!
 - Summer registration opens in mid-February,

Early College

- <u>Early College</u>- complete your senior year of high school on a college campus
 - Earn up to 30+ college credits for FREE!
 - <u>CCV's Early College</u> program application is now open. Priority deadline May 1st, 2023 and final deadline August 10, 2023
 - Students must enroll in courses full-time for both the fall and spring semesters
 - Courses must satisfy high school graduation requirements so that students graduate from high school at the end of the spring semester
 - Students pay for textbooks, lab fees, materials fees, and any other costs associated (Financial Assistance is available)
 - Students are eligible to play sports at BHS while enrolled in Early College.

PSAT, ACT, and SAT

- Many colleges have moved to test optional
- Students can Take ACT and/or SAT
- ACT at BHS April 18, 2023
- Tests are given on Saturday mornings
 - Sign up for the test on-line at the ACT or SAT websites
 - Sign up early to insure a spot
- Tests cost approximately \$60.00
- Fee waivers are available for students receiving free/reduced lunch

ACT vs. SAT

- ACT Content-based test. Meant to test skills learned in school.
- Serious time pressure. Rewards fast reader, doing math in your head; enjoy science and using tables, graphs
- SAT Reasoning test. Combine info and analyze real-world problems; like doing math by hand; don't like science
- Good at analyzing texts in English class. You like informational graphics. Answer questions using data from charts and graphics.

ACT and SAT (continued)

- Local high schools host the tests*
- SAT is offered on: 3/11 (Rice and SB), 5/6 (Rice, SB and Essex), 6/3 (SB and Essex).
- ACT is offered on: 4/18/23 @BHS
- Free SAT test prep through Kahn Academy. Access via Collegeboard.org
- ACT Free Test Prep Guide via their website
- Not all colleges require these tests
 UVM test optional Fairtest.org lists
 test opt. schools
- SAT Subject tests have been discontinued

Talk it Over:

- Individual conversations with school counselors
- Ask family and friends how they chose their colleges
- Talk to teachers, coaches, neighbors or mentors about their college decisions
- Interview a person in a field or career in which you have an interest; how did they get there?
