

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Significant Impacts 2021 - Present

In March of 2021 Burlington High School students were relocated to a temporary school campus housed in a renovated Macy's department store located in downtown Burlington. Though the building continues to evolve into a more visually and functional traditional school, learning in a converted space comes with many challenges, i.e. classrooms without fully encapsulated walls, no gymnasium nor auditorium, nor direct access to playing fields. It is one of only three buildings in the state of Vermont with an (frequently dysfunctional) escalator.

All students have access to free lunch, city transportation services, athletics, extracurricular activities, and school counseling services. The greater Burlington community is supportive of the transition and challenges that have accompanied student life after the Covid-19 pandemic and construction of a new high school building (scheduled to open in the fall of 2026). The graduating class of 2025 will be the second cohort of Seahorses to complete high school entirely in our downtown location.

Based on 2023-2024 School Year

- BHS offered 12 Advanced Placement classes (approximately 300 seats)
- 6 students spent their senior year enrolled in Early College
- 145 college classes were completed through the VT Dual Enrollment program
- Combined, over 60 students participated in programming at Burlington Technical Center and the Center for Technology Essex
- 2 National Merit Commended Scholars

- 19 students engaged in virtual learning using 41 seats through a partnership with Vermont Virtual Learning Collaborative (VTVLC)
- 42 students participated in Burlington City and Lake, an intensive semester where the city is used as their classroom and curriculum
- 1 Poetry Out Loud State Semi-Finalist
- 8 NCAA Division I and II athletes committed to being student athletes
- BHS teams took home 5 State Championships and 4 individuals won the title of State Champ.
