Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment

BHS juniors and seniors have the opportunity to take two free college-level courses while enrolled at BHS through the Agency of Education's Dual Enrollment program.

Vermont's Dual Enrollment Program allows high school students to take two (4 credit) college courses prior to their high school graduation. Participating students earn high school and college credits, reducing the time it takes to get a college degree, potentially reducing the cost associated with college, while challenging themselves through college level curriculum.

Eligibility

Every junior and senior at Burlington High School is eligible for two free college courses prior to graduation. (Students must have at least 12 high school credits to be eligible.) Please note rising 11th graders will be eligible to register for classes the day after graduation.

How It Works

- Explore course options at the college's website.
- Complete the BHS Dual Enrollment form (on reverse side) and return to Ms. Stein.
- Apply for a Dual Enrollment voucher dualenrollment.vermont.gov/vtde
- The voucher covers the cost of tuition for up to a 4-credit course at any of the participating colleges. The voucher does not cover the costs of materials, textbooks, and fees. All materials and fees are the responsibility of the student. Some funding is available through VSAC to help cover these additional costs for students who are eligible for free and reduced price lunch.
- Vouchers are awarded on a semester-by-semester basis, and unused vouchers expire every semester.
- Complete College Registration paperwork. (Each student will be walked through this process because it is different at each participating college.)
- Some schools may require a placement test and/or copy of the BHS transcript.
- Courses taken through the Dual Enrollment Program will be recorded on the student's high school transcript.
- Dual enrollment courses must be represented in the student's Personalized Learning Plan (PLP).
- It is the responsibility of the student to share their 504 or IEP with the college if they would like to explore having accommodations.
- Once the student is enrolled in the dual enrollment class the student is responsible for all communication with the college.
